Aim of This Policy

Main Principles

DCTTC upholds the following fundamental principles:

Awareness of Responsibilities:

Welfare is Paramount:

The welfare of all individuals, children and adults alike, is always our top priority.

Right to Protection:

All members have the right to protection from abuse, irrespective of their age, culture, disability, gender, racial origin, religious belief, and/or sexual identity.

Prompt and Sensitive Response:

Any allegations or concerns raised will be taken seriously. DCTTC guarantees a prompt, sensitive, and appropriate response to all reports, ensuring all necessary actions are taken.

Fair Processes:

Our processes for dealing with complaints and allegations are fair, transparent, and open to challenge through the appeals process.

Support for Whistleblowers:

DCTTC is committed to supporting anyone who, in good faith, reports concerns. This commitment is crucial in fostering a culture of trust and integrity within the club.

Adherence to Guidelines:

All staff, volunteers, and members are required to adopt and abide by DCTTC's Safeguarding Guidelines, which are outlined in our separate policies.

Confidentiality:

Personal information related to safeguarding matters will be treated in strict confidence within the boundaries of the law. However, in circumstances where a child or adult is at serious risk of harm or a crime is believed to have been committed, statutory agencies including the Police, Children's Services, Adult Services and the NSPCC may be informed.
